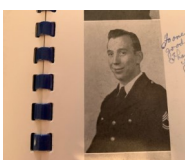

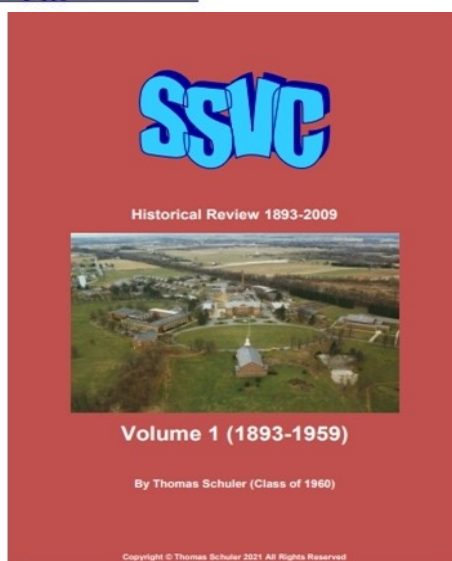

John learned hard work, dedication, importance of giving back, discipline from all of the staff and coaches. School Records

Alumni and Students with graduating years of 1976-2009 need to contact the DMVA. The contact person at DMVA is Callie Miller. Her number is 717-861-8656. Ms. Miller has your records at Ft. Indiantown Gap in Annville, PA and is very helpful and quick to turn around requests. Alumni and Students with graduating years of 1895-1975 need to request records from the PA State Archives. You may ask the State Archives representative to copy everything in your record. To release copies of files to former students and alumni, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania State Archives will need a written request from the student/alumnus, signed by the student/alumnus. Send the student/alumnus's full name, date of birth and Social Security number. Research and copy fees will apply to mail requests. The Research fee is \$15.00 for requests from Pennsylvania residents; \$25.00 for requests from out of state. The Copy fee for the first 10 pages is free; thereafter it is \$0.50 per page plus shipping and handling for additional pages. Mail your request to State Archives, PA Historical & Museum Commission, 350 North St., Harrisburg. If the student/alumnus visits in person, the State Archives representative will need to see current identification such as a driver's license or passport. Copying fees will apply: \$0.50 per page. For inquiries, the State Archives number is: (717) 783-3281.

“Scotland School Alumni Association”

100th Anniversary 1920-2020

Can you believe it? Our Alumni Association is 100 years old! Our School was 114 years old when it closed. The School had many forces behind it to remain open as long as it did. Sadly, enough shortsighted people closed the School in June 2009. But, there have been enough loyal, loving, and caring about each other alumni to keep our Alumni Association going for slightly over 100 years at this writing. Thank God!

The opening paragraph of the five-page document that recorded the first Alumni Association meeting reads, "The reunion of the S.O.I.S. Alumni was formally opened in the school chapel the morning of August 27, 1920 at 10:45 a.m. when Colonel W. C. Bambrick, Superintendent of the school, called the assemblage of between two and three hundred former pupils to order." Colonel Bambrick was followed by the chaplain, Reverend J.A. Waters who gave an opening prayer and then turned the meeting over to the Chairman of the Association, James "Jimmy" A. Grimes, class of 1901 who was voted president of the group. Chairman Grimes appointed a number of committees necessary for the organization of the association. As they say, the rest is history.

So, here we are. Many thanks to the presidents who succeeded Jimmy Grimes and the officers who supported all the presidents that followed down through the years. Currently, Ken Beck '74, President; Jim Lowe '70, Vice President; Vickie Portner Cook '73, Secretary; Ken Beck, Acting Treasurer; Dave Portner '69, Sergeant-At-Arms; and Dave Shaw '75, Sergeant-At-Arms are serving as our officers. We owe you a huge debt of gratitude. While we appreciate all that you continue to do so the SSVCA Alumni Association may endure, it takes all of us who care about our Association to see it last for many more years. *Thank you* to everyone that sends donations, items for the museum, and helps at the various events. Let's all continue to do our part!
